Spotlight on Members

All of our members have wonderful and personal stories to share about their love of gardening. We thank John Stahl for sharing his with us.

John Stahl was raised in a small town in northern New Jersey called Mountain Lakes. He had his first garden at the age of 6 when he threw seeds into his parent's compost and grew squash and cucumbers which he sold in a little red wagon to his neighbors. Thus began a lifelong passion for gardening. Upon graduating from Susquehanna University with degrees in Accounting, Economics and Spanish he was hired by Ford Motor Company, Lincoln Division into their marketing and sales division out of New York. When they wanted to move him to Detroit he decided to leave the company and went into the retail side of the car business. After 20 years as a General Manager of two dealerships, one on Long Island and one in Princeton, NJ he left the car business. He decided that after working weekends for so many years it was time to have a life like normal people. Through those years he always owned properties that often had the nicest flower and vegetable gardens in the neighborhood. His passion for plants both indoor and outdoor has often been a burden to his partner.

Besides his work life and garden he has been very active in charity work in his communities. He has been on three YMCA board of directors including chairman of the board of the Princeton YMCA and many other boards. He has been on one YMCA charity fund for almost 40 years and is its current Chairman. He feels he has been very fortunate and has an obligation to give back to others.

Nineteen years ago he moved to north eastern PA with his husband, Joe Metzler, to become a house flipper, landlord and now contractor. He has owned 30 plus properties (8 currently) and loves watching the progress of an ugly duckling becoming the swan on the lake. Whenever he sells a property he makes sure the gardens and landscaping are the first thing people see making them welcoming to the next home buyer. Curb appeal is the best way to get someone look at your house!

In lieu of the over exaggerated housing prices for the past several years he does a lot of construction work at three different clothing optional campgrounds building structures, decks, outdoor kitchens, bathrooms and complete gutting of older trailers. It makes for an interesting job site. If all goes well within the year he will be retiring so he can continue to expand his gardens at Acre Lake, Kingsley and doing side jobs for friends and family. He and Joe enjoy traveling and see themselves seeing more of the vast world we live in and experience other cultures and food.
